PUBLIC COMMENT

Bret Healy, Consultant with Four Directions, Inc. from rural Chamberlain, SD, spoke on Jackson County voting rights litigation pertaining to the establishment of a satellite voting center in Wanblee on the Pine Ridge Indian Reservation. Mr. Healy requested that Minnehaha County reach out to the South Dakota Public Assurance Alliance and ask what their risk management strategy is relative to this case, since Minnehaha County is one of the biggest contributors to the South Dakota Public Assurance Alliance. Commissioner Barth spoke in support of Mr. Healy's comments.

HEARING

Kevin Hoekman, Planner 1, was present for the public hearing and gave a briefing on Rezoning request #15-05 to rezone approximately 18 acres of a parcel approximately 20.11 acres in size from A-1 Agriculture to C Commercial District for future land development. One building eligibility would remain available for use on the approximately 1.8 acres on the south west corner of the parcel which would remain zoned as A-1 Agriculture. The legal description of the property is Tract 3 (Ex H-1) & (Ex South 260' of West 300') Krells Addition SE 1/4 SE ¹/₄, Section 36-T101N-R51W, Wall Lake. The petitioners are Amanda and Josh Nelson. The property is owned by Roberta Wagner and Stephanie Kriens. The petitioners expressed plans to construct a reception hall to be rented for private gatherings and corporate meetings. The property is located adjacent to the south of Wild Water West. The subject property is not located within a Rural Service Area as identified in the 2015 Minnehaha County Comprehensive Plan. The proposed site is located in the Agriculture Production area which is characterized as suitable for further agricultural development. Staff recommended denial of Rezoning #15-05 as it generally does not meet the policies and objectives of the Comprehensive Plan. The Minnehaha Planning Commission voted 3 ayes and 1 nay to deny the rezoning request on July 27, 2015. The petitioners, Amanda and Josh Nelson, 204 Park Drive, Lennox, SD, were present and spoke on their plans for constructing a reception hall on the property and requested approval of the rezoning request. No one spoke in opposition to the request. MOTION by Kelly, seconded by Barth, to overturn the Planning Commission's denial of Rezoning #15-05 and approve Ordinance MC16-143-15 An Ordinance Amending the 1990 Revised Zoning Ordinance for Minnehaha County by Rezoning Certain Property. 4 ayes. The entire Ordinance is on file at the Minnehaha County Auditor's Office.

SPECIAL EVENT ON-SALE LIQUOR LICENSE

The application for a Special Event On-Sale Liquor License from Bottom's Up for the Farewell to Huset's Concert was withdrawn due to the event being cancelled.

AGREEMENT

Monte Watembach, Information Technology Director, gave a briefing on an agreement between Minnehaha County and Berry Dunn for the selection of an Enterprise Resource Planning System. The agreement includes the development of the request for proposal document, vendor evaluation and selection, and contract negotiation assistance. Mr. Watembach stated that Information Technology personnel savings could be utilized to cover the cost of this agreement. MOTION by Barth, seconded by Kelly, to authorize the Chairperson to sign the agreement between Minnehaha County and Berry Dunn for consultant services for the selection of an Enterprise Resource Planning System in the amount of \$97,400, and to utilize Information Technology Department personnel savings to cover the cost of the agreement. 4 ayes.

BRIEFING

DJ Buthe, Highway Superintendent, gave a briefing on the Highway Funding Bill (SB1) adopted during the 2015 Legislative session. The new legislation allows counties to increase the wheel tax, which is used to support the highway road and bridge fund, from \$4 per wheel to \$5 per wheel, and increase the number of taxable wheels from 4 to 12. Currently Minnehaha County collects \$4 per wheel up to 4 wheels per vehicle, and retains 90% of the Wheel Tax. The remaining revenue is split between municipalities and townships within the county, each receiving 5%. In 2014 Minnehaha County collected \$3,245,000 in wheel tax revenue. Raising the wheel tax to \$5 per wheel without increasing the number of wheels taxed, would result in an increase of approximately \$811,000. The State estimates the number of untaxed wheels, those above 4 but less than 8, in Minnehaha County to be 4,200. The estimated increase in wheel tax for the additional 4,200 wheels would be approximately \$21,000. Mr. Buthe recommended making no change to the wheel tax at this time.

CHANGE ORDER

DJ Buthe, Highway Superintendent, gave a briefing on Change Order #1 in the amount of \$3,700 to the contract with Prahm Construction for Project #MC122BR-15, Reconstruction of Bridge Structure #50-243-100 on Highway 122, ¼ mile east of Highway 121. The increase is for additional work for the removal and disposal of concrete and rubble from previous structures. The contractor also requested one additional working day to the contract. MOTION by Barth, seconded by Bender, to authorize the Chairperson to sign Change Order #1 to the contract with Prahm Construction for Project #MC122BR-15 for a new contract amount of \$464,493.15, and a new completion date of November 16, 2015. 4 ayes.

SCHOOL DISTRICT BOUNDARY CHANGE

Robert Wilson, Assistant Commission Administrative Officer, requested approval of a resolution setting the effective date of a boundary change for the Sioux Falls and West Central School Districts. MOTION by Bender, seconded by Barth, to approve Resolution MC15-52. 4 ayes.

RESOLUTION MC15-52 SCHOOL DISTRICT MINOR BOUNDARY CHANGE

WHEREAS, SDCL §13-6-85 and §13-6-86 allow for school district minor boundary changes when all statutory and factual requirements are met; and the West Central School District 49-7 and the Sioux Falls School District 49-5 received a petition for minor boundary change involving the property located in western Sioux Falls, Minnehaha County, South Dakota, originally assigned to the West Central School District and seeking to be changed to the Sioux Falls School District; and

WHEREAS, by Action 36890.B8, adopted April 28, 2014, the Sioux Falls School District approved the Petition to Make a Minor Boundary Change to transfer the area to the Sioux Falls School District; and

WHEREAS, by Action 36959, adopted July 14, 2014, the Sioux Falls School District and the West Central School District executed an tax-sharing revenue agreement for the Cherry Lake Reserve Addition; and

WHEREAS, by Action 37258.C7a, adopted July 27, 2015, the Sioux Falls School District clarified the legal description of the land to be annexed into the Sioux Falls School District and the land to stay in the West Central School District; and

WHEREAS, by Action 15-18, adopted July 14, 2014, the West Central School District executed an taxsharing revenue agreement for the Cherry Lake Reserve Addition with the Sioux Falls School District; and

WHEREAS, by Action 15-94 – Resolution 2015-03, adopted November 17, 2014, to transfer the property known as Cherry Lake Reserve Addition from the West Central School District to the Sioux Falls School District; and

WHEREAS, by Action 15-216, adopted May 27, 2015, results in a ballot on Resolution 2015-03 whereby the resolution was upheld by the voters of the West Central School District; and

WHEREAS, by Action 16-21, adopted August 10, 2015 the West Central School district clarified the legal description of the land to be transferred into the Sioux Falls School District; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to SDCL §13-6-86.1 and SDCL §13-6-87, the county commission of Minnehaha County, the county with property affected by the boundary change, is required to set the effective date of the boundary change for tax allocation purposes, as well as school district voting purposes; now

THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, by the Minnehaha County Board of Commissioners that the minor boundary change approved by the Sioux Falls School District 49-5 and the West Central School District 49-7 transferring the property in western Sioux Falls, Minnehaha County, South Dakota, legally described in Exhibit A1, attached hereto, from the West Central School District 49-7 to the Sioux Falls School District 49-5 shall be effective July 1, 2015.

CONTRACT

Robert Wilson, Assistant Commission Administrative Officer, gave a briefing on proposals received from AVI Systems, Inc. and South Central AV to replace the audio and video recording and broadcast equipment in the Commission Meeting Room with high definition systems. The proposals have been reviewed by the Commission Office, Information Technology Department, and Citylink technicians who are responsible for compatibility of the county system with Citylink. Citylink staff has advised if the lower proposal submitted by South Central AV was accepted, additional a la carte equipment would be needed to provide the full functionality the county requires. The additional costs would make the cost comparison nearly identical. Based on the review, the Commission Office recommended accepting the proposal submitted by AVI Systems, Inc. at a cost of \$48,788. MOTION by Barth, seconded by Bender, to accept the proposal and authorize the Chairperson to sign the contract with AVI Systems for Commission Meeting Room Audio & Video Upgrades in the amount of \$48,788. 4 ayes.

PROPERTY SALE

Wildcat Roofing in the amount of \$139,527. 4 ayes.

Robert Wilson, Commission Administrative Officer, gave a briefing on possible methods of sale for two county owned parcels, RDID 14086 and RDID 14088. On April 14, 2015, the Commission approved Resolution MC15-21 declaring the parcels as surplus and authorizing an appraisal by the Minnehaha County Surplus Appraisal Board. The appraisal board report was officially received at the commission meeting on June 2, 2015. In accordance with state statute, the Commission may opt to sell the properties by sealed bids, by public auction, or by a real estate broker. Robert Litz, Minnehaha County Auditor, stated the parcels could be auctioned along with the tax deed properties at the annual tax deed auction in September. MOTION by Barth, seconded by Kelly, to authorize the sale of RDID 14086 and RDID 14088 at the annual tax deed auction in September. 4 ayes.
