LIEN COMPROMISE

Robert Wilson, Assistant Commission Administrative Officer, gave a briefing on an application for a compromise of lien for DPNO 21379 in the amount of \$12,922.05. Public defender, court appointed attorney, public advocate, and poor relief services were provided to the applicant between July 2000 and September 2012. The County Commission compromised a prior balance of \$3,572.50 in full with no payment in December 1998. On October 1, 2013, the Commission approved Resolution MC13-54 compromising and releasing the lien in the amount of \$12,922.05 in full upon payment of \$1,000. Payment was to be made within one year from approval or the agreement would be null and void. No payments were received. The applicant is in the process of purchasing a home scheduled to close on November 4th, 2016, and is requesting a compromise and release of the lien in full upon payment of \$1,000. The applicant lists \$6,300 in liabilities, total assets of \$5,020, and three weeks net pay of \$1,354.20. A 2015 tax return shows a refund of \$786 and a refund of \$721 in 2014. The applicant was present and spoke on his reasons for requesting the compromise, his desire to put his life back in order, and the reason he did not make a payment after the compromise in 2013. Commissioners Barth and Bender expressed concern for offering a compromise when there has been no attempt to make payments. Commissioner Kelly expressed his concern for the applicant's lack of accountability to pay the lien. Commissioner Bender stated the offer of \$1,000 is significantly less than the typical fifty percent (50%) the Commission would consider granting. A friend of the applicant spoke in support of the compromise and the character of the applicant. Commissioners Barth and Bender expressed support of a compromise for \$2,500. Commissioner Beninga spoke in support of a compromise to help the applicant get his life back on track. MOTION by Barth, seconded by Bender, to approve resolution MC16-59. 3 ayes. Kelly voted nay. Motion passes.

Robert Wilson, Assistant Commission Administrative Officer, gave a briefing on an application for a compromise of lien for DPNO 5720 in the amount of \$20,067.05 and DPNO 58772 in the amount of \$944.28. DPNO 5720 is in the name of the applicant and her ex-husband. Public defender, rental assistance, hospital/medical assistance, and fuel/utilities services were provided to the applicant and her ex-husband between February 1984 and October 2014. Due to County policy providing for the compromise of any lien over \$20,000, there have been 12 partial compromise of lien actions on DPNO 5720. Partial payments have also been received. The applicant and her husband divorced in February 2005. Services provided after the divorce were solely for the applicant's exhusband. DPNO 58772 is for poor relief services provided to the applicant between January 2006 and February 2006 with a partial payment and a collection fee received in 2008. The proceeds from the sale of the applicant's mother's house are currently being held in escrow pending the resolution of this lien. The applicant and her exhusband list assets of \$9,270 including the value of a 2010 Lincoln Aviator, liabilities as monthly bills including \$940/month for housing and a bank loan. They have provided their 2015 tax return. The applicant is requesting a compromise and release of the lien in full upon payment of \$2,000. The applicant was present and spoke on her reasons for a request for compromise. MOTION by Barth, seconded by Bender, to approve resolution MC16-61. 4 ayes.

AMBULANCE ORDINANCE HEARING

A public hearing and second reading was held to consider amendments to MC31-3-10, an Ordinance for Licensing Surface Ambulance Service in Minnehaha County. Commissioners were provided a copy of the Ordinance with proposed amendments, copies of the Primary Service Area Map (Appendix A), the Automatic Aid Map (Appendix B), and a copy of the Mutual Aid Agreement. Robert Wilson, Assistant Commission Administrative Officer, gave a briefing on MC31-3-10 and the proposed amendments.

The first amendment is an update to Appendix A, the Primary Services Area Map, to take effect January 1, 2017. The service areas have been adjusted to create better ease of use and ensure safety. Each ambulance service and Metro Communications has agreed to the new map. Lynn DeYoung, Emergency Management Director, spoke on the changes in the map and expanded on the reasons behind making these changes. Jack Masur, President and CEO of Med-Star Paramedic Ambulance, Inc., spoke in support of this amendment and would like the map to go into effect as soon as possible. Jessica Mundahl, Assistant Director of Metro Communications, spoke on the length of time needed to prepare for the new service areas. Sara Show, Senior Deputy State's Attorney, stated November 30th, 2016, is the earliest the map could take effect due to this being an ordinance change. Dr. Jeff Luther, Rural Ambulance Quality Assurance Director, spoke in support of the amendment and is in favor of it taking effect before January 1, 2017. MOTION by Kelly, seconded by Barth, to approve the update to Appendix A, the Primary Services Area Map. 4 ayes.

The second amendment is the adoption of Appendix B, an Automatic Aid Map. The map indicates which ambulance service would get the first mutual aid call should the primary service not be available. MOTION by Barth, seconded by Bender, to approve the adoption of Appendix B, an Automatic Aid Map. 4 ayes.

The third amendment includes updates to Section 1-2, License Term, changing the license term from two years to one year. Mr. DeYoung stated the reasons behind changing license terms, how the upcoming review of the current delivery system of rural ambulance services by an independent consultant could affect the decision on this amendment in the future, and suggested leaving the license terms as they are until the results of the review have been received. Ms. Show stated if the Commission approves a one year license term, then the license would be effective from January 1st of one year until January 1st of the next year. Mr. DeYoung stated the review results should be available by July 2017. Commissioner Bender stated being in favor of leaving the license term at two years. Jack Masur, President and CEO of Med-Star Paramedic Ambulance, Inc., spoke in opposition of the amendment and in opposition of the County hiring an independent consultant to conduct a review of the current delivery system of rural ambulance services. MOTION by Barth, seconded by Bender, to leave Section 1-2, License Term, as a two year term. 4 ayes.

The fourth amendment is an update to Section 1-6, paragraph 4, Staffing Requirements, to reflect a change in state statute. Every provider will have two emergency medical technicians on board, which meets the state statute requirements. Mr. DeYoung explained how this decision was made, the costs of staffing, and the certification and recertification time and requirements for staff. MOTION by Bender, seconded by Barth, to approve an update to Section 1-6, paragraph 4, Staffing Requirements, to have a minimum of two emergency medical technicians on board. 4 ayes.

The fifth amendment is an update to Section 1-10, Geographic Boundaries, adding a reference to a mutual aid agreement requirement. The Emergency Management Office and the State's Attorney's Office worked together to draft the mutual aid agreement, which would now be a requirement to get an ambulance license if approved. Mr. DeYoung stated this is something the ambulance services already provide, and the update is more of a formality for the purpose of the ordinance. MOTION by Kelly, seconded by Barth, to approve an update to Section 1-10, Geographic Boundaries adding a reference to a mutual aid agreement requirement. 4 ayes.

The entire Ordinance MC31-4-16, An Ordinance for Licensing Surface Ambulance Service in Minnehaha County, is on file and available for inspection at the County Auditor's office.

Dr. Jeff Luther, Rural Ambulance Quality Assurance Director, gave a briefing on applications received from ambulance services wishing to obtain county licenses to operate for the 2017-2018 term. There are six Primary Service Areas (PSA) in Minnehaha County, and applications were received from the following providers: Dell Rapids Community Ambulance, PSA 1; Garretson Community Ambulance Corp., PSA 2; Humboldt Fire & Ambulance Service, PSA 3; Jasper Community Ambulance, PSA 4; Med-Star Paramedic Ambulance Inc., PSA 5; and Paramedics Plus, LLC, PSA 6. Dr. Luther presented his review of Basic Life Support indicators of each ambulance service. All applicants meet the requirements for county licensure per Ordinance MC 31-3-10. MOTION by Barth, seconded by Bender, to approve the following 2017-2018 ambulance licenses: Dell Rapids Community Ambulance, PSA 1; Garretson Community Ambulance Corp., PSA 2; Humboldt Fire & Ambulance Service, PSA 3; Jasper Community Ambulance, PSA 4; Med-Star Paramedic Ambulance Inc., PSA 5; and Paramedics Plus, LLC, PSA 6. 4 ayes.

CONTRACTS

Jeff Gromer, Jail Warden, gave a briefing on the per diem contracts with 14 counties to house inmates in the Minnehaha County correctional facilities. Under the terms of the contract, the daily rate for housing inmates in other than a work-release setting is \$93.43. This is an increase from the current rate of \$92.27. For inmates in a work-release setting, the daily rate is \$35.00, the same as the current rate. For inmates authorized to participate in the Electronic Monitoring Work Release program the rate is \$15.00 per day. Individual counties would be responsible for any medical expenses the inmate would require. The contracts will be subject to a 30 day written notice to rescind or cancel by either party.
