Upon the request of Carey Deaver, Human Resources Director, MOTION by Karsky, seconded by Bender, to approve immediate hire for the new Tax and License Technician position included in the 2018 provisional budget. 5 ayes.

Carey Deaver presented a request from the State's Attorney's Office to hire the new Chief Civil Deputy State's Attorney at a higher pay grade than would be the traditional starting range. This request is due to the high quality of the applicant with her high level of experience. Tom Hensely, Chief Criminal Deputy State's Attorney, spoke in support of the hire at the requested pay range. MOTION by Bender, seconded by Barth, to approve the hire of Donna Kelly as Chief Civil Deputy State's Attorney for the State's Attorney's Office at \$4,119.20 bi-weekly (25/11) effective 8/21/17. 5 ayes.

PUBLIC COMMENT

Pam Nelson, Treasurer, thanked the Commission for their approval of the new Tax and License Technician positon.

David Zokaites, 2215 E Mulberry St, Sioux Falls, presented the second part of his three part presentation regarding drug prohibition specifically highlighting topics dealing with marijuana.

ORDINANCE

Kevin Hoekman, Planner, was present for the second reading and public hearing on the 2017 Revised Floodplain Management Ordinance MC51-17. The new ordinance is needed to be compliant with changes made by the Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA) to the flood insurance rate panel maps. The ordinance will also include amendments regarding DENR approval of septic systems, flood proofing in residential developments, and a reference to a technical bulletin for how to contract a functionally depended facility. FEMA, the State, and the State's Attorney's Office have reviewed the new ordinance. No one spoke in opposition. MOTION by Karsky, seconded by Heiberger, to approve Ordinance MC51-17 An Ordinance Providing For The Adoption Of The 2017 Revised Floodplain Management Ordinance For Minnehaha County And For The Repeal Of All Ordinances And Resolutions In Conflict There With. 5 ayes. The entire ordinance is on file and available for inspection at the County Auditor's Office.

APPEAL

David Heinold, Planner, gave a briefing on an appeal filed by Tony Lee on the Planning Commission's decision to approve Conditional Use Permit (CUP) #17-46 to exceed 1,200 square feet of total accessory building area on the property legally described as Lot 2, Holbeck Addition, N1/2 & E1/2 NE1/4, S34-T103N-R49W, approximately 5 miles north of Sioux Falls. The Planning Commission approved the CUP unanimously at their July 24, 2017, meeting. Jim Holbeck, 27339 Ridgeway Road, Harrisburg, the petitioner, stated his request for the CUP to construct a 40' x 60' storage shed. Tony Lee, 47563 255th St, Renner, the appellant, raised concerns regarding drainage and road maintenance. Mr. Holbeck responded to concerns brought forward by Mr. Lee citing a drainage ditch near his property and noting he is the new owner of the property and was not involved with decisions made by the former owner. Based on the contour map provided, research done, and the site visit, Mr. Heinold stated he believes the majority of the rain will drain to the northwest of the proposed building except in the event of an extreme rain event. Scott Anderson noted Helen Trail, near Mr. Holbeck's property, is a private road, based on the plat, and is maintained by individuals who utilize the road. MOTION by Heiberger, seconded

by Bender, to approve CUP #17-46 to exceed 1,200 square feet of total accessory building area on the property legally described as Lot 2, Holbeck Addition, N1/2 & E1/2 NE1/4, S34-T103N-R49W. 5 ayes.

AGREEMENT

Lynn DeYoung, Emergency Management Director, gave a briefing on the Emergency Management FFY 2018 State and Local Agreement between the State of South Dakota and Minnehaha County which will be used to support salary and administrative expenses within the Minnehaha County Emergency Management Office. This is a 50% reimbursement grant and requires a 50% match from the county. The actual dollar amount will be determined when the federal fiscal budget is passed. For FFY2017, Minnehaha County received \$223,298.42. MOTION by Barth, seconded by Heiberger, to authorize the Chair and Emergency Management Director to sign the 2018 Emergency Management State and Local Agreement between the State of South Dakota and Minnehaha County. 5 ayes.

BRIEFING

Bob Litz, Auditor, gave a briefing on an upcoming purchase request for 100 Express Vote machines from ES&S at a total cost of \$328,000. These Express Vote machines would replace the Auto Marks currently being used for elections, modernize the early voting process, and allow for the use of the most updated election software. The County currently has \$465,000 of Help America Vote Act funds available, which are specifically for the upgrade of election equipment. This item will be brought back for final decision at the August 22, 2017, Commission Meeting.

CONTRACT

Bill Hoskins, Museum Director, presented a contract with Peska Construction for the construction of the Siouxland Heritage Museums Storage Facility at a cost of \$3,234,000. Peska was awarded the bid for the project at the Joint Minnehaha County/City of Sioux Falls Meeting on July 25, 2017. The signing of the contract would authorize Peska to begin construction. MOTION by Heiberger, seconded by Karsky, to authorize the Chair to sign the Contractor Contract with Peska Construction for the construction of the Siouxland Heritage Museums Storage Facility at a cost of \$3,234,000 beginning upon execution of the contract. 5 ayes.

LIAISON REPORT

Commissioner Heiberger reported on attending the South Dakota Association of County Commissioners (SDACC) Board of Directors meeting in Chamberlain, SD on August 9-10, 2017, where three resolutions were brought forward by Pennington County, it was advised that the counties and municipalities pick their top resolutions to bring forward at the upcoming SDACC convention, and noted that many of the topics brought forward could be included in the policy statements.

NEW BUSINESS

Commissioner Barth commented on items brought up by David Zokaites during public comment and noted recent news articles regarding marijuana. Bob Litz, Auditor, noted the South Dakota Association of County Commissioners Convention in September will have a speaker from Colorado presenting on the legalization of marijuana. Commissioner Heiberger noted that deaths due to opioid use is a growing issue and stated that marijuana is directly linked with a lot of social issues.

MOTION by Barth, seconded by Heiberger, to adjourn into executive session for contracts and personnel. 5 ayes.

The Commission adjourned until 9:00 a.m. on Tuesday August 22, 2017.
