PUBLIC COMMENT

Commissioner Beninga announced the public hearing originally noticed for the October 24, 2017, meeting to take action on the County's animal control ordinance has been delayed. Anyone interested in speaking on the topic was offered the opportunity to speak during public comment. No one came forward.

Bob Litz, Auditor, announced a Moody's ratings call will take place in the Auditor's Office on November 1, 2017, at 10:00 a.m.

Jason Gearman, Deputy Sheriff Captain, spoke on the Sheriff's Office process when conducting liquor license compliance checks noting the October 19, 2017, check resulted in seven violations. Commissioners expressed their concerns and disappointment in the recent number of violations this year.

SPECIAL EVENT LICENSE

A public hearing was held for a Special Event On-Sale Liquor License Application submitted by Prairie Pasta Inc. dba Johnny Carino's. The license would allow the sale and consumption of liquor at a corporate event to be held on December 8, 2017, taking place at the Blue Haven Barn. The licensed property is legally described as Track 3 (Ex #1) Krell's Addition SE ¼ 36-101-51 Wall Lake Township, located at 46594 268th St. No one spoke in opposition. MOTION by Barth, seconded by Heiberger, to approve the Special Event On-Sale Liquor

License for Prairie Pasta Inc. dba Johnny Carino's for a corporate event to be held on December 8, 2017, at Blue Haven Barn. 5 ayes.

PUBLIC NUISANCE

Kevin Hoekman, Planner I, gave a briefing on a Public Nuisance Ordinance violation at the property owned by Cheryll Angle. The property is legally described as the E33 Vac Row of Ted Dr Lying Adj & Tract 11 N1/2 S30-R101-T48 Iversons Tracts Sec 21, N1/2 SEC 30, & N1/2 SEC 33-T101-R48 Split Rock Township. The first site visit was on January 30, 2017, where staff found unlicensed vehicles. After further monitoring of the site, the owner was sent a notification letter on May 5, 2017, to make her aware of the violation. On June 1, 2017, the Planning Department received a call regarding the Angle property where the caller indicated he intended on taking care of the vehicles. By June 2, 2017, one vehicle had been removed, one vehicle was licensed, and one vehicle had no change. A site visit on June 20, 2017, showed no change. A second notification letter was sent to the owner on June 21, 2017. On July 13, 2017, a licensed car was in the front yard, fireworks debris was in the yard, the lawn had been mowed, and another vehicle was in the backyard. Another site visit on August 23, 2017, showed two unlicensed vehicles had been moved onto the property, the firework debris remained, and a vehicle was in front of the garage. The final letter was sent to the property owner on August 24, 2017 giving the owner until September 29, 2017, to take care of the violations. On the same day a complaint call was received stating there were 4 inoperable vehicles, weeds 3 feet in height, and rats on the property. On October 2, 2017, five vehicles were on the property. A notice of public hearing for October 24, 2017, was sent via certified mail and first class mail on October 5, 2017. A phone call was received on October 10, 2017, from a neighbor who was concerned people were living in the garage. On October 18, 2017, notice was sent to nearby neighbors to inform them of the public hearing, and another site visit was done showing four vehicles, a lawn mower, and a folding table were on the property. Due to the property having visible unlicensed vehicles and junk that has increased in quantity since staff has made contact, the Planning and Zoning Department believe that the only recourse is to declare the property a public nuisance to allow Minnehaha County to remove the violations from the property. Cheryll Angle, 7001 E 26th Street, Sioux Falls, the property owner, addressed the violations noted by the Planning and Zoning Department. The firework debris has been removed, licenses have been obtained for one of the vehicles, and one vehicle is being picked up by 12:00 p.m. on October 24, 2017. Due to a fire that took the home originally on the property in 2016, the key to one of the vehicles was lost. Ms. Angle indicated she has started the process to get the title to that vehicle in her name, as it is currently under the title company, in order to get a new key made. The garage that remains on the property is being used to store items that were salvaged from the fire and does not have enough room to store the vehicles. Ms. Angle stated she has hired a construction company to build a new home on the property, and that they are taking care of the building permits. Work on the home is expected to begin in approximately two weeks, and will take up to two months depending on weather conditions. Ms. Angle indicated her intention to request the help of the construction company to remove the large root system that is currently on the property. Due to an accident resulting in the breaking of both of her feet, Ms. Angle stated she is not physically capable of removing this herself. Ms. Angle also spoke on dealing with anxiety and depression that has made it difficult for her to clean up the property. Velder Williams, 7001 E 26th Street, Sioux Falls, stated he has been working on one of the vehicles on the property and that he is in the process of a title transfer. Due to the circumstances, Commissioners expressed being in favor of delaying the declaration to allow for further time for cleanup of the property. MOTION by Heiberger, seconded by Bender, to delay the declaration of a public nuisance and have the Planning and Zoning Department check the property in eight weeks for cleanup progress. 5 ayes.

Kevin Hoekman, Planner I, gave a briefing on a Public Nuisance Ordinance violation at the property owned by Tamera and Mike Day. The property is legally described as the N114 W73 Peterson Tract 2 SW1/4 SW1/4 S17-T103-R50 Lyons Township. This property has a history of noncompliance and was declared a nuisance and abated by the County two years ago. Cindy Heiberger relayed a complaint regarding the Day property on July 7, 2017, which prompted a site visit. The site visit showed tall grass, many tall thistles, and vehicles from the last clean up were still present and unlicensed. The owners were sent a notification letter on July 7, 2017, to make them aware of the violation. On the August 14, 2017, site visit, there was no change. A second notification letter

was sent on August 15, 2017. At the next site visit on September 5, 2017, the grass had been mowed with the exception of areas where the weeds were tall, none of the vehicles had been licensed, a tractor tire was on the property, and a tree branch pile remained on site. The final letter was sent to the property owners on September 7, 2017, giving the owners until September 29, 2017, to take care of the violations. The October 2, 2017, site visit showed no change. A notice of public hearing for October 24, 2017, was sent via certified mail and first class mail on October 5, 2017. On October 18, 2017, notice was sent to nearby neighbors to inform them of the public hearing, and another site visit was done showing no change. Due to receiving no response from the owners and the lack of removing junk, weeds, and unlicensed vehicles, the Planning and Zoning Department believe that the only recourse is to declare the property a public nuisance to allow Minnehaha County to remove the violations from the property. The property owner was not in attendance. Justin Hackett, 319 5th St, Lyons, neighbor of the property, supported declaring the property a public nuisance and spoke on issues with the property including the unlicensed vehicles, debris and animals inside the building on the property, and an old box from a vehicle on the property. Mr. Hackett stated the owner only mows the property once a year. Photos of property taken from Mr. Hackett's yard were shown to the Commission. Paul Siemonsma, 309 1st Ave, Lyons, expressed his concern that the property could be dangerous to children playing in the area, and also noted issues with debris in the building. Mr. Hoekman reported taxes on the property are current. Scott Anderson, Planning Director, explained any costs charged to the County by the company doing the cleanup is placed on an assessment against the property and must be paid prior to paying property taxes. MOTION by Barth, seconded by Karsky, to declare the property legally described as the N114 W73 Peterson Tract 2 SW1/4 SW1/4 S17-T103-R50 Lyons Township a public nuisance and enact SDCL 21-10-6 to authorize the Planning & Zoning Department to abate the nuisance by removing the violations from the property. 5 ayes.

LIAISON REPORT

Commissioner Barth reported on the Minnehaha County Fire Chiefs Association meeting in Humboldt, SD where many volunteer fire departments attended, and it was noted that representatives were sent to the funeral of Presho Fire Chief Donald Manger who passed away in the line of duty.

Commissioner Barth reported on the October 23, 2017, Planning Commission meeting where a large crowd came to discuss a gravel pit north of the airport.

Commissioner Bender reported the Urbanized Development Commission notified her of a Project CAR fundraiser on October 26, 2017, at First Lutheran Church. Project CAR provides safe transportation to people in the area.

Commissioner Karsky reported on the October 19, 2017, Bishop Dudley Hospitality House Sleep Out where people slept outside to bring awareness to the issue of homelessness in Sioux Falls.

MOTION by Bender, seconded by Barth, to adjourn into executive session for contracts. 5 ayes.

The Commission adjourned until 9:00 a.m. on Tuesday October 31, 2017.
