Kevin Hoekman, Planner, gave the first reading and requested authorization for the Auditor to publish a Notice of Hearing for text amendments to Ordinance MC30-02, the Revised Joint Zoning Ordinance for Minnehaha County and the City of Sioux Falls by revising Article 15 – Additional Use Regulations regarding accessory building and uses. MOTION by Barth, seconded by Bender, to authorize the Auditor to publish a Notice of Hearing on January 23, 2018, to consider the text amendments. 5 ayes.

PUBLIC HEARING

Olivia Larson, Deputy Auditor, was present for a public hearing on a Retail On-Sale Liquor License application submitted by Garretson Sportsmen's Club for the 2018 licensing year. The State's Attorney Office, Sheriff's Office, and Planning & Zoning Department have reviewed the application with no concerns or objections reported. Steve Davis, Garretson Sportsmen's Club President, introduced himself and was available to answer Commissioners' questions. MOTION by Barth, seconded by Beninga, to approve the 2018 Retail On-Sale Liquor License application for Garretson Sportsmen's Club, legally described as Track 1 in the NW ¼ of the NW ¼ of S33-T103-R47 Minnehaha County, South Dakota. 5 ayes.

AGREEMENTS

Keith Wynia, Air Guard Supervisor, gave a briefing on the FY 2018 Joint Security Protection Agreement between Minnehaha County and the South Dakota Department of the Military. The agreement is for \$932,535. The total projected cost for FY2018 (October 1, 2017 thru September 30, 2018) is \$834,102. MOTION by Beninga, seconded by Karsky, to authorize the Chair to sign the FY2018 Joint Security Protection Agreement between Minnehaha County and the South Dakota Department of the Military in the amount of \$932,535. 5 ayes.

DJ Buthe, Highway Superintendent, presented a Professional Services Agreement between Minnehaha County and Short Elliot Hendrickson, Inc. for final design services to replace Structure #50-293-200 on Spook Road (264th Street) southeast of Brandon and about 0.7 miles west of Highway 109 over Beaver Creek. Based on

preliminary engineering, a 119 foot long, two span, pre-stressed concrete girder bridge is recommended. The cost of services is not to exceed \$58,984. MOTION by Karsky, seconded by Barth, to authorize the Chair to sign the Professional Services Agreement between Minnehaha County and Short Elliot Hendrickson, Inc. for final design services to replace Structure #50-293-200 at a cost not to exceed \$58,984. 5 ayes.

DJ Buthe, Highway Superintendent, presented a Professional Services Agreement between Minnehaha County and Civil Design Inc. for preliminary engineering services for the replacement of Structure #50-205-060 located on Highway 114 (250th Street) approximately 0.25 miles east of Baltic. The cost of services is not to exceed \$29,500 and will be billed at hourly rate increments. MOTION by Karsky, seconded by Bender, to authorize the Chair to sign the Professional Services Agreement with Civil Design Inc. for Structure #50-205-060 at a cost not to exceed \$29,500. 5 ayes.

INSURANCE

Carol Muller, Commission Administrative Officer, presented a claim offer in the amount of \$6,100 received from Claims Associates, Inc. representing Larry and Winona Juhnke and North Star Mutual Insurance Company in regard to the December 11, 2017, accident involving a County owned 2004 Ford Expedition. The National Automobile Dealers Association clean retail value of the vehicle is \$5,125. Craig Dewey, Assistant Commission Administrative Officer, presented the annual review of the Minnehaha County Facility Power Outage Response Protocol that went into effect January 1, 2012. The policy has been sent to Department Heads for review and discussion with staff.

NEW BUSINESS

Commissioner Barth congratulated Minnehaha County Deputy Sheriff Captain Michael Walsh, who appeared on the front page of the Argus Leader for receiving a national award from the Federal Law Enforcement Officers Association for his involvement in the investigation of a 2011 murder case in Sioux City. Captain Walsh stated the case was very interesting, noted the Sheriff Department's willingness to work with other departments, and thanked the reporter who wrote the article.

Commissioner Heiberger stated the 2018 liaison assignments may be coming out later this week.

Upon the request of Commissioner Heiberger, Margaret Gillespie, Senior Deputy State's Attorney, read from SDCL 1-25-2(1) and (3) in regard to moving into executive session. MOTION by Bender, seconded by Karsky, to move into executive session for personnel and litigation per SDCL 1-25-2(1) and (3). 5 ayes.
