SPECIAL EVENT LICENSE HEARING

A public hearing was held for a Special Event On-Sale Liquor License Application submitted by Philanthropy Promotions Inc. The license would allow the sale and consumption of liquor at a fundraising event to be held on July 14, 2018, taking place at the W.H. Lyon Fairgrounds. The licensed property is legally described as Tracts 1, 2, & 3 WH Lyon Addn to City of Sioux Falls, located at 100 N Lyons Blvd, Sioux Falls. No one spoke in opposition. MOTION by Karsky, seconded by Bender, to approve the Special Event On-Sale Liquor License for Philanthropy Promotions Inc. for a fundraiser to be held on July 14, 2018, at the W.H. Lyon Fairgrounds. 4 ayes.

REZONING HEARING

Kevin Hoekman, Planner, was present for the public hearing and gave the second reading of an amendment to Ordinance MC16-90, the 1990 Revised Zoning Ordinance. The amendment is to rezone from the A-1 Agriculture District to the Hope Harbor Planned Development District for the property legally described as beginning in the SE corner of Section 9-102-50 Thence W 716', Thence N 510', Then Northeasterly 864', Thence E53' Thence South 1060' to the point of the beginning. Unplatted Property SE ½ Section 09-120-50 Benton Township, Minnehaha County, South Dakota. The property is 13.2 acres of a parcel of land that is approximately 159 acres in size, and is approximately ½ mile southwest of Crooks. The property is owned by Crooks Investment, LLC. The petitioner for the rezoning is Hope Harbor. The property owner has donated the land to the petitioner on the condition that the rezoning is approved. The petitioner intends to construct a group home for teen boys, who will live at the group home for approximately twelve (12) months. The site plan includes three (3) dwellings, three (3) out buildings to be utilized for school and vocational activities, a driveway, and small parking lot for each accessory building. Phase One for the site plan would be the construction of one (1) home that would house up to nine (9) boys and one (1) outbuilding that would house the school and vocational activities. The additional dwellings and outbuildings would come at a later phase if expansion was needed.

The ordinance amendment includes permitted uses; accessory uses; parking regulations; sign regulations; and density, area, yard, and height regulations. Other regulations include limiting the number of allowed dwellings to

three (3); meeting appropriate state and federal design, operating, and licensing requirements; and three rows of trees to be planted as a buffer along the south boarder. The Minnehaha County Comprehensive Plan does not directly address the development of land for non-profit groups and institutions, but does include an action step to work with schools and public institutions for planning and siting of future development. The City of Crooks has been growing in the direction of the proposed development. The proposed development does have the potential to increase the density of dwellings. The rezoning proposal generally meets the policies and objectives of the comprehensive plan, and the County has supported a similar type of planned development with a mix of institutional, agricultural, and dwelling uses. The Planning Commission voted four (4) in favor and three (3) opposed to the rezoning. Mr. Hoekman stated up to six (6) youth may reside in a foster home, licensed or approved by a governmental agency, as part of a family dwelling. The planned development lists group home as a permissive use, therefore, any additional specifications as to the type of group home would need to be added to the ordinance amendment. Mr. Hoekman provided a comparison between the zoning of McCrossan Boys Ranch and Hope Harbor.

Communications via email and letter were received prior to the hearing from the following proponents: Ray Brooks, Dana Dykhouse, Audra Eide, Blake Hoffman, Kent Huisken, Val Huisken, Don Jacobs, Dale Jelen, Peter Kavula, Bruce Lamprecht, Daniel Lemme, Matt McCaulley, Cindy McKittrick, Cheryl Moe, Rick Odland, Doug Reade, Claudia Stenson, Kristin Swanson, Paul TenHaken, Jay Woudstra, Rob Broin, and Brad Gruhot. Communications via email and fax were received prior to the hearing from the following opponents: Jeannine Deters, Troy Kretzschmar, Jeanette and Randy Nielson, Betty Twiss, Cory Wintersteen, Nick Wintersteen, Derry and Jan Benson, Kevin Boysen, Cheryl Ferrie, Nancy Nelson McGraw, Rayla and Dave Otto, Vicki Siemonsma, Brent Williams, and Vincent Berry. A letter of opposition was received prior to the hearing from Tom Wintersteen that included a list of the names and addresses of 130 people with a designation of landowner and/or resident. Communication via email was received prior to the hearing from Aaron Schave, who neither expressed favor for or opposition against the rezoning.

The following proponents spoke: Claudia Stenson, 2158 Granite Cir NW, Rochester, MN, Founder of Hope Harbor, Governing Board Chair, and Expansion Coordinator; Dan Lemme, 45245 South Dakota Highway 34, Madison; Eric Willadsen, 902 S Cleveland Ave, Sioux Falls, Willadsen Lund Engineering; David Edwards, 606 E Tan Tara Cir, Sioux Falls, Attorney for the petitioner; and Cindy McKittrick, 690 Maple Street, Wabasso, MN, Hope Harbor Executive Director. The proponents spoke on the following topics and responded to concerns raised by the opposition: the Christian basis of the program; the success of other Hope Harbor locations; goals and objectives of the program; the voluntary placement program; the education, life skills, and counseling provided to the residents; the involvement of the family in their child's program; the boys' behavioral and criminal background factors that affect their program eligibility; the staffing plan; the neighborhood meetings held with area residents; how the location was chosen and other locations considered; Hope Harbor's 501(c)(3) status; the site plan and phases; engineering of the site; the plan for septic and water; the floodplain; the reason for and the creation of the exit strategy; the donation of the land being contingent on the approval of the rezoning; comparison to McCrossan Boys Ranch; denial of a similar rezoning request in Lincoln County; the origin of referrals to the program; the need for this type of facility in Minnehaha County; the current ownership of the property; and how the development fits into the Minnehaha County Comprehensive Plan. Mr. Willadsen provided a FEMA Floodplain Map for the site area. Scott Anderson, Planning Director, spoke on floodplain ordinance requirements, the governing agency that oversees the septic system, and the steps to gain a floodplain development permit and elevation certificate.

The following opponents spoke: Brian and Michelle Rippentrop, 46857 256th St, Crooks; William Pearson, 25678 465th Ave, Hartford; Jeannine Deters, 25774 468th Ave, Crooks; Tom Wintersteen, 25821 469th Ave, Sioux Falls; Ronald Johnson, 25732 466th Ave, Hartford; Oran Sorenson, 25504 485th Ave, Garretson; and Derry Benson, 25819 468th Ave, Sioux Falls. The opponents spoke on the following topics: the creation of building eligibilities; concerns regarding spot zoning and sprawl; the effect on traffic and road maintenance; security and safety of the neighbors and the boys; the effect on the surrounding agricultural land and eco-system; the availability of emergency services; housing density; the floodplain; the exit strategy; water line easements in the

area; the effect on property values; whether or not the group home will receive any type of licensure through the State; question of ownership of the land being for-profit versus non-profit; whether or not the use fits with the Minnehaha County Comprehensive Plan or the 1990 Revised Zoning Ordinance, Article 10, PD Planned Development District; Crooks growth development challenges; how it will affect current residents seeking a country lifestyle; decrease in tax revenue for the County due to the non-profit status; and alternate locations. Mr. Benson also expressed his safety concerns by providing an example of boys from McCrossan Boys Ranch stealing his truck. Upon the request of Commissioner Karsky, Mr. Anderson spoke on what constitutes a residence.

MOTION by Karsky, seconded by Bender, to defer action for one week. Commissioners Beninga and Heiberger stated they would prefer to consider action prior to choosing to defer. Commissioner Karsky withdrew his motion. Commissioner Bender withdrew her second. Commissioner Karsky stated being in opposition of rezoning due to the rezone not meeting the intent of a PD Planned Development District in the following areas: the compatibility with the area, redevelopment of contiguous large lots, and preserving unique and natural features. Mr. Hoekman spoke on the intent of a PD Planned Development District and provided examples of approved and denied districts. Upon the request of Commissioner Bender, Mr. Hoekman stated the Planning and Zoning Department's reasons for recommending approval of the rezone indicating the type of institution and the proximity to Crooks' growth area were factors. Mr. Hoekman also addressed the current building eligibilities and how eligibilities are affected by a rezone. Commissioners Beninga, Bender, and Heiberger expressed support for the rezoning citing the need for this type of organization in Minnehaha County, the expected growth of the area, exit strategies being typical practice, and the opportunity to add provisions to the ordinance for any areas of concern. Commissioner Heiberger also noted her appreciation for Hope Harbor doing a planned development and allowing the County to be involved to place provisions on the development, as opposed to utilizing the one available building eligibility that does not require County approval. MOTION by Beninga, seconded by Karsky, to approve Ordinance MC16-153-18 with the addition of the following provisions: 6d. If State regulations require a certification or licensure for the type of group home program, the certificate or licensure must be obtained within one year. 3 ayes. Karsky voted nay. The entire ordinance is on file and available in the Auditor's Office.

AMENDMENT

Carol Muller, Commission Administrative Officer, presented an amendment to the Professional Services Agreement between Minnehaha County and Infrastructure Design Group for preliminary engineering on County Highways 146 and 103. The amendment would eliminate items associated with completing the preliminary engineering tasks related to the rehabilitation of Highway 103. The total fee reduction would be \$7,080 from the original fee amount of \$178,179 to a total fee amount of \$171,099. Due to utility delays, the amendment will allow for the completion date to be extend to March 31, 2018. MOTION by Beninga, seconded by Bender, to authorize the Chair to sign Amendment 1 to the Professional Services Agreement between Minnehaha County and Infrastructure Design Group, Inc. to be completed on March 31, 2018, with an amended agreement amount of \$171,099. 4 ayes.

AGREEMENT

Erin Srstka, Commission Program Development Officer, presented an agreement between Minnehaha County and OpenLattice for the design and implementation of a pretrial case management system, court reminder application, and a call-in defendant check-in system. The agreement outlines the following services and their costs: data integration service, no cost; Public Safety Assessment tool, no cost; pretrial case management tool, \$100 per monthly active user (MAU); defendant check-in system, \$50/MAU; court reminder short message service system, \$10/MAU; court reminder voice call system, \$25/MAU; and premium support, \$100/MAU.
