Lyon Addition to the City of Sioux Falls, Minnehaha County, South Dakota. Craig Lauritzen, HR Green Company, spoke on the design process, temporary access, and scheduling for the project. MOTION by Beninga, seconded by Bender, to authorize the Chair to sign the Permanent Sidewalk & Public And/Or Private Utility Easement Agreement with the City of Sioux Falls. 5 ayes. MOTION by Bender, seconded by Karsky, to authorize the Chair to sign the Temporary Construction Easement Agreement with the City of Sioux Falls. 5 ayes. MOTION by Bender, seconded by Beninga, to authorize the Chair to sign the Permanent Pedestrian/Bike Trail Easement Agreement with the City of Sioux Falls. 5 ayes.

## PRESENTATIONS

Holly Behrens, Sioux Falls Area Chamber of Commerce Agri-Business Division Manager, presented on the Argi-Business Division's annual events, new events, and future goals highlighting the 2018 Sioux Empire Farm Show. Jo Beal, Sioux Empire Farm Show Committee Member, spoke on her appreciation for Ms. Behrens.

Kari Benz, Human Services Director, gave a presentation on the Human Services Department services, challenges, strategic planning, and department strengths.

Mark Kriens, Facilities Director, gave a presentation on the Facilities Department 2017 and 2018 project lists and additional areas the department is working on such as the fairgrounds project list and the masterplan study.

## **BID AWARDS**

DJ Buthe, Highway Superintendent, reported on the 2018 Annual Highway Department Materials bid letting. Bids were received for four of the five proposal items from the following companies: Myrl & Roys Paving, Inc., Nordik Blades, Equipment Blades, Inc., Diesel Machinery, Inc., Titan Machinery, Concrete Materials, Blackstrap, Inc., Cargill Incorporated, Central Salt, LLC, Compass Minerals America, Inc., Johnson Feed, Inc., Mills and Miller, Inc., and Nebraska Salt & Grain Company. Mr. Buthe recommended the following bid awards: Proposal #2, Hot Mix Asphalt Concrete Pavement, Concrete Materials, Inc.; Proposal #3, Snowplow and Motor Grader Blade Cutting Edges, Titan Machinery; Proposal #4, Abrasive and Salt Mixture (Salt Sand), Concrete Materials, Inc.: Proposal #5, Rock Salt and Transportation, Nebraska Salt & Grain Company. There were no bids received for Proposal #1, Medium-Curing Cutback Asphalt (MC-70). Once current stock is depleted, the Highway Department will purchase less than \$25,000 worth of asphalt without the necessity of a formal bid. The low bidder, based on unit bid price, for Proposal #5, Rock Salt and Transportation, was Blackstrap, Inc. Due to Blackstrap, Inc. submitting the incorrect bid form and not meeting contract requirements from the previous year, Blackstrap, Inc. is considered a non-responsive and a non-responsible bidder. Therefore, Nebraska Salt & Grain Company was recommended for the bid award as the second low bidder based on unit price. Maggie Gillespie, Senior Deputy State's Attorney, confirmed the State's Attorney's Office's concurrence with the recommendation for Proposal #5. MOTION by Bender, seconded by Karsky, to award the bids for Proposal #2, Proposal #3, and Proposal #4 as recommended. 5 ayes. MOTION by Barth, seconded by Karsky, to reject the bid from Blackstrap, Inc. for Proposal #5 due to a non-responsive bidder and a non-responsible bidder. MOTION by Karsky, seconded by Barth, to award the bid for Proposal #5 to Nebraska Salt & Grain Company. 5 ayes.

Commissioner Heiberger reported on attending the Sioux Falls Area Chamber of Commerce meeting where reports were given on Pheasant Fest and the School District.
