BRIEFING

Bob Litz, Auditor, and Jason Toering, Computer Support Technician, gave a briefing on the DEFCON 26 Hackers Convention in Las Vegas, NV between August 9, 2018, and August 12, 2018. Specific to the County, the convention offered demonstrations regarding election equipment vulnerabilities and election cyber security. It also provided the opportunity for attendees to meet with people in the industry such as representatives from the Department of Homeland Security and ES&S. Three key takeaways noted were the physical security of the election equipment, the physical security of the election software/programing, and the virtual security of the voter registration database.
