BID AWARD

DJ Buthe, Highway Superintendent, reported on the December 19, 2018, bid opening for Bid #18-17, Project MC17-19, 2019 Culvert Replacement. Five bids were received from the following companies: First Rate Excavate Inc, \$1,078,000.00; Midwest Contracting LLC, \$1,091,424.30; Henning Construction Inc, \$1,197,328.15; H&W Contracting LLC, \$1,297,197.41; and Soukup Construction Inc, \$1,305,956.61. The engineer's estimate was \$1,358,401.23. Staff recommends awarding the bid to the low bidder, First Rate Excavate Inc. The completion date of the project is set for October 15, 2019. MOTION by Karsky, seconded by Heiberger, to award Bid #18-17, Project MC17-19, 2019 Culvert Replacement to First Rate Excavate Inc in the amount of \$1,078,000.00 and to authorize the Chair to sign the contractor contract. BRIEFING

Sheriff Mike Milstead gave a briefing on his office's goal to expand the EMT Deputy Program to increase certifications from 15 to 20 Deputies.

POLICY REVIEW

Craig Dewey, Assistant Commission Administrative Officer, presented the annual review of the Minnehaha County Facility Power Outage Response Protocol that went into effect January 1, 2012. The policy has been sent to Department Heads for review and discussion with staff.

LIAISON REPORTS

Commissioner Heiberger reported on attending the Sioux Falls Area Chamber of Commerce's most recent Legislative Breakfast where legislators spoke on their vision for this year. Commissioner Heiberger also reported on visiting with Brown County in Aberdeen as the State JDAI Co-Chair to discuss their progress.

Commissioner Beninga thanked Mark Kriens, Facilities Director, and staff for their work on the capital improvements schedule and staying in budget.

Commissioner Barth reported that the Metro Communications Board is waiting to hire a new director until more firm decisions have been made on items the board is considering such as a potential new location and the expansion of capabilities.

Mr. Watembach and Mr. Litz also spoke on next steps and ideas for avoiding the issue in the future. Mr. Litz stated that it is his goal for everything to be done by the end of the week.

Commissioner Barth stated it was a special day due to his last swear-in as a County Commissioner. Commissioner Barth also congratulated the other officials sworn in during the meeting; and stated that he hopes to help make Minnehaha County the best county in the State during his last term in office.

Craig Dewey, Assistant Commission Administrative Officer, stated the 2019 Legislative Session would be starting at 12:00 p.m. on January 8, 2019. He stated he would be providing weekly updates to the Commission, and spoke on the process for decision making when a quick turnaround time was necessary. Mr. Dewey requested direction from the Commission regarding the process. The Commission directed Mr. Dewey to continue with the current process.
