Chris Lilla, Director of Equalization, recommended the denial of an abatement for Parcel ID 90846, 2018 property taxes, in the amount of \$995.50. The property was assessed on November 1, 2017, as Parcel ID 61120. On November 7, 2017, Parcel ID 61120 was platted into three smaller parcels including Parcel ID 90846. Brant Etrheim purchased Parcel ID 90846 on December 4, 2017. The 2018 tax year began on January 1, 2018, for 2018 taxes payable in 2019. Brant Etrheim, 509 Sarah C St, Garretson, spoke on his request for an abatement of 2018 property taxes payable in 2019 and was available to answer questions from the Commission. Mr. Etrheim stated that he did live on the property in 2018. Additionally, Mr. Etrheim stated he did not receive an assessment, and he should not have received the tax bill. Due to not having owned the house on the date of assessment in November of 2017, Mr. Etrheim believed he should not be responsible for the taxes. Margaret Gillespie, Senior Deputy State's Attorney, spoke on the following: the applicant's request, state law regarding splitting property, property taxes being a lien on real property, and who may or may not be responsible to pay taxes due and owing. Commissioner Karsky reported that the Lincoln County and Minnehaha County Economic Development Association provides a detailed metropolitan statistical area report on their website.

### **NEW BUSINESS**

Commissioner Barth suggested the County consider looking into a noise ordinance specific to rural residential neighborhoods. Commissioner Karsky reported on recently being contacted by a citizen who made comments regarding Minnehaha County not having engine braking noise signs like many other parts of South Dakota.

### **OLD BUSINESS**

Commissioner Barth commented on strengthening the County's infrastructure to withstand more natural disasters and noted that California is discussing updating their infrastructure after the recent earthquakes.
