Jason Gearman, Director of Emergency Management, provided an update on the recent storm that took place in Sioux Falls involving three tornados, the aftermath of the storm on the County (including flooding), and the recovery efforts.

#### LEGISTLASTIVE AUDIT REPORT

Jeff Schaefer, Department of Legislative Audit, gave a briefing on the Management Letter that summarizes the findings of the fiscal and compliance audit for Minnehaha County 2018 year end. Finding #2018-001 noted a significant deficiency in the County's cash internal control.

#### FY2020 BUDGET

Carol Muller, Commission Administrative Officer, gave a briefing on the FY2020 Final Budget which stands at \$92,066,110. There are twenty (20) new positions as follows: one Legal Office Assistant for the Public Defender's Office, two Deputy State's Attorney's for the State's Attorney's Office (SAO), two Digital Discovery Technicians for the SAO, one Diversion Coordinator for the SAO, thirteen (13) Correctional Officers for the Jail, and one Juvenile Correctional Officer II for the Juvenile Detention Center. The cash applied total is \$4,237,941. Opt-out funds in the amount of \$1.75 million will be accessed from the \$6.5 million opt-out that was authorized in July 2019. The final budget reflects growth of 2.86%. The CPI adjustment is 2.4%. MOTION by Heiberger, seconded by Beninga, to adopt the Final FY2020 Minnehaha County Budget, and Resolution MC19-39. ## AGREEMENT

Carol Muller, Commission Administrative Officer, introduced Tom Weerheim and Erin Johnson, Mental Illness Board Co-Chairs, who presented a Joint Cooperative Agreement for the temporary consolidation of Mental Illness Boards between Minnehaha County, Lincoln County, and Yankton County. Due to recent tornadoes in southern Sioux Falls, Avera Behavioral Health's ability to provide hospitalization to people being assessed by the Board of Mental Illness for involuntary commitments (IVC) has been affected. A temporary hospital within the Human Services Center (HSC) in Yankton was set up by Avera. The agreement would allow temporarily consolidation of the mental illness boards of Minnehaha, Lincoln, and Yankton Counties to ensure the proper oversight of IVCs. The agreement would begin immediately and would be terminated on June 30, 2020 or until Avera Behavioral Health ceases to place patients on the HSC campus, whichever comes first. MOTION by Karsky, seconded by Beninga, to authorize the Chair to sign the Joint Cooperative Agreement for Temporary Consolidation of Mental Illness Boards between Minnehaha County, Lincoln County, and Yankton County beginning immediately. 5 ayes.

# CONTRACT

Carol Muller, Commission Administrative Officer, gave a briefing on the 2020-2022 contract between Minnehaha County and Highway Union, Local 2561, Council 65 of the American Federation of State, County, and Municipal Employees. The three year contract is effective December 14, 2019, thru the last payroll period of 2022. The following major changes were made to the contract: Article 1, collapsing of job titles; Article 3.1, the pay matrix adjustments of 3% for 2020, 2% for 2021, and 1.5% for 2022, or the pay matrix increase approved for general County employees, whichever is greater; Article 3.2, Mechanic Team Member will move from a Grade 14 to a Grade 15; Article 4.4, removal of a defined 15 minute clean-up period; Article 4.10 was added for reasonable paid clean-up time; Article 4.5, definition of early start; Article 5, payout of unused compensatory time to be the second pay date in December; Article 6, increase in uniform allowance and prorating of uniform allowance per quarter for new employees in lieu of providing uniforms; Article 7.4, clarification that seniority is a determining factor for conditions of employment only when knowledge, skills, abilities, performance and experience of employees are otherwise equal; Article 8.2, reduction in number of Team Leader positions; Article 8.5, clarifications on salary placement during voluntary and involuntary demotions; Article 14, addition of management rights; Article 16.2, clarification on notification of the Highway Superintendent or immediate supervisor when PTO is requested for illness/injury; Article 16.3, increasing the amount of ESL that can be taken following birth or adoption of child; and Article 16.12, any employee hired on or after January 1, 2020 will not be eligible for retiree health insurance. MOTION by Barth, seconded by Karsky, to authorize the Chair to sign the three year County Highway Workers Contract between Minnehaha County and Highway Union, Local 2561,

Council 65 of the American Federation of State, County, and Municipal Employees effective December 14, 2019 thru the last payroll period of 2022. 5 ayes.

The MOU would allow for a maximum of three informational meetings to discuss the pay matrix. Additionally, the MOU would not obligate either party to any current or future contract terms. Commissioner Beninga thanked the staff at the Fairgrounds and the Juvenile Detention Center for their work during the recent tornados.

Commissioner Karsky reported on the work of the Highway Department to assist with a township road that is currently the only access in and out of the City of Baltic.

Commissioner Bender reported that the facility planning group for the jail expansion project met last week. The project is under budget and going well.
